This event is sanctioned by the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc., hereinafter referred to as “USDAA”. The rules and regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. as amended January 1, 2004 shall apply at this event. A copy of USDAA rules and regulations may be obtained for \$7.00 (includes S&H) online at www.usdaa.com, USDAA Store. Please do not include with entry fees.

ENTRIES & CLOSING DATE

All entries must be received no later than 5:00 PM, Wednesday, August 17th, 2005. No cancellations are permitted after August 17th. A secondary closing date of August 29th, is offered for advancement in level only. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Amounts shall be paid within 30 days of postmarked notice of returned check if such date follows the event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog’s registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse. No refunds of overpayments for amounts of \$10.00 or less after deduction of service fees.

The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor of dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by the competitor of dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.

To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or legal guardian if handler is a minor), received by the initial closing date and accompanied by the correct fees (see entry form for fee structure).

A registration form is included with this Test Schedule. If your dog is not already registered with USDAA, you must complete and submit this form with your entry. All dogs must be registered with USDAA (registration has a “U” prefix) in order to enter. If your dog’s registration card was issued with the “A” prefix, this indicates the dog was not 18 months of age at the time of registration; no additional registration is required as long as the dog is 18 months of age by the event date. To obtain a registration number immediately and a height card prior to the event, go online to www.usdaa.com, General Information, Dog Registration.

JUMP HEIGHTS

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance Program heights in parentheses):

AWARDS

Test Classes: First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each class for each jump height. Pairs will be awarded for mini and open first through fourth place. Maroon qualifying ribbons will be awarded to those dogs earning qualifying scores.

Grand Prix of Dog Agility®: 1st through 3rd place rosettes for each height and maroon and white ribbons for a qualifying score.

Performance National StandardSM: 1st through 3rd place rosettes for each height and maroon and pink ribbons for a qualifying score.

Dog Agility Steeplechase®: Prize money will be awarded in the Dog Agility Steeplechase® as described in this test schedule under the class description for the steeplechase.

CHECK IN AND STARTING TIME

Early check in will be Thursday evening from 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm for dogs that do not require measurement. Check-in on Friday, Saturday and Sunday will be from 7:00 am to 7:30 am at which time a judge will be available for measuring. All dogs must be measured unless a permanent registration card, properly completed temporary measurement card or authorized check-in letter from USDAA is presented at the time of check –in. Judge’s briefings and/or walkthroughs are expected to begin at 7:45 am each day, with the first class starting at 8:00 am.

STANDARD AGILITY

A standard agility course consists of a numbered sequence of obstacles and demonstrates a dog/handler team’s speed, accuracy and teamwork. Standard agility classes are scored pursuant to Chapters 3-5 of USDAA rules and regulations.* Please note: Effective January 1, 2004 the table count will be five CUMULATIVE (not consecutive) seconds in Advanced standard class.

NON-STANDARD CLASSES

All non-standard classes are scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 6-7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations

Gamblers Class: consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the ‘opening’ period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the ‘opening’ the handler attempts the ‘gamble’, a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA rules and regulations.

Jumpers Class: consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA rules and regulations.

Pairs Relay: consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA rules and regulations

Snooker Class: consists of an ‘opening’ sequence of point collection similar to the gamblers class followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. Roughly parallels the billiards game of ‘Snooker’ requiring the dog to successfully complete a ‘red’ jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provision of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA rules and regulations

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

CHAMPIONSHIP DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a Starters Standard title. Starters Non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the Starters level classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog*® title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title or the Advanced Standard title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

PERFORMANCE PROGRAM CLASSES

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the *Performance Dog ISM* title, the Performance Standard I title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog ISM title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog ISM* title, the Performance Standard I title, the *Agility Dog*® title or the *Veteran Agility DogSM* title, but has not earned the *Performance Dog IISM* title or Performance Standard II title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog ISM* title, the *Agility Dog*® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance II class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Performance Dog IISM* title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog IISM* title, the Performance Standard II title, the *Advanced Agility DogSM* title, or the *Veteran Advanced Agility DogSM* title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog IISM* title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

2005 DOG AGILITY STEEPLECHASE® LOCAL QUALIFIER

Description: The “Steeplechase” is a two-round tournament with emphasis on speed. Each round will be conducted on a jumpers-style course with the inclusion of an A-frame and weave poles, either of which shall be required to be performed twice. The top 30% of competitors (minimum of four, some of whom may be non-qualifiers) shall advance to Round 2 to compete for prize money and Tournament Top Ten points (see separate qualification standards below). However, a competitor who receives an elimination in Round 1 is ineligible to advance. This tournament is open to all competitors (i.e. starters, advanced or masters) regardless of previous accomplishments in competition.

Scoring: The tournament shall be conducted pursuant to USDAA Championship Program rules as stipulated herein. Scoring in each round shall be on a time plus faults basis with a five-point penalty added to a competitor’s performance time for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle or missed contact. Running the wrong course shall be scored as an elimination as determined under Masters level rules. No refusals or missed weave poles shall be penalized; however, all obstacles must be completed before continuing on the remainder of the course.

Qualification: Only competitors placing within the top 30% of the number competing in their height class shall qualify. Those earning a qualifying score are eligible for entry to the Dog Agility Steeplechase® Championships to be held in the autumn of 2005.

Awards: Prize money shall be computed based upon 30% of the total entry fees for the tournament class for all jump heights collectively, or such greater amount per height class that a host organization may designate. Allocable prize money at local and regional qualifying events shall be distributed among eligible finalists in accordance with the following prize allocation table, regardless of the size of entry in the class; however, allocable amounts to finalist positions that are not filled for any reason or allocable prize amounts less than \$1.00 shall be forfeited.

2005 USDAA® Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships Local Qualifier

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an Aframe, dog walk, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules, except that time standards may generally range from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for dogs competing in the 22” and 26” height classes and from 2.85 to 3.05 yards per second in the 12” height class and from 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second for dogs competing in the 16” height class. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in Round 1 of a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2005 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, may be obtained directly from USDAA.

2005 USDAA® Performance National StandardSM Championships Local Qualifier

(Formerly called Performance Grand Prix)

This class is also open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level and utilizes the rules and course design outlined for the Grand Prix of Dog Agility®. The standard course time for this class will be calculated by adding three (3) seconds to the standard course time as determined for Grand Prix. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in Round 1 of a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the Nationals Performance Championships quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2005 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, may be obtained directly from USDAA.

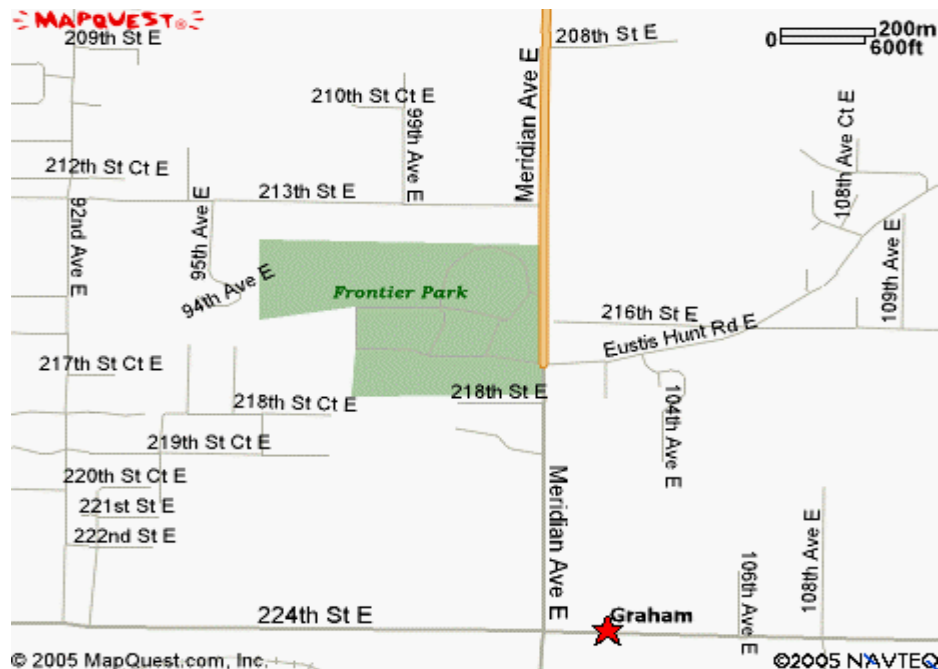

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations, which are hereby incorporated by reference, including, but not limited to, the following rules and conditions for submission and acceptance of entry:

- This test is open to all dogs at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitch in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's ability to perform safely, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- All dogs must be registered with USDAA and have the appropriate "U" number in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. A registration form may be obtained online at www.usdaa.com. General Information/Dog Registration, or registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule.
- Two rings will run at the same time.
- No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Safety shall always be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers through entry at this event accept full responsibility for themselves, their guests and the actions of their dogs.
- No entries shall be accepted, changed, altered, or withdrawn for any reason after the closing date except as provided in the section titled "ENTRIES & CLOSING DATE" herein.
- THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. There will be no refunds under \$10.00 for reason of overpayment of fees.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.
- A partial refund of 75% of fees paid will be given after the Closing Date until the day before the trial for bitches in season, injured, or ill dogs (with vet verification) and injured or ill handlers (with doctors verification).
- DOGS MUST REMAIN ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES, except when competing in the ring or in the warm-up area.
- No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated kennel areas. **Redhot Rovers** cannot and do not assume any liability for loss of any items left unattended.
- Dogs must be exercised only in the designated areas. Please pick up after your dog.
- FAULT LIMITS may BE APPLIED in all classes for which faults are assessed. Limits shall be announced during the judge's briefings.
- Competitors may set up on Thursday afternoon AFTER the rings are laid out.
- ALL COMPETITORS through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video and broadcast rights for this event are the exclusive property of USDAA.
- All tenting and parking will be restricted to designated areas. As with all spectator venues, you are encouraged to present yourself and your dog in the best manner possible, including attire and sportsmanship. Help us to preserve such venues by following all show ground rules. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
- This event is being held outdoors with limited shade trees near the rings. Please bring adequate shade protection for sun and rain. There are bathroom facilities near the rings.
- Fast food, grocery stores, and restaurants are nearby the show site.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW SITE

SITE: Frontier Park is on the west side of Meridian Ave in Graham, WA. The entrance to the park is directly off Meridian St. near the intersection of Meridian and 216th St. E.

FROM I-5 (PORTLAND):

Take I-5 north to highway 512 and go east about 8 miles to Puyallup and exit at South Hill (Meridian St). Take Meridian St. south approx. 7 miles toward Graham. Look for the park on the right.

FROM THE NORTH ON 167:

Take 167 south to highway 512 towards Puyallup. Exit at South Hill and follow Meridian St. South approx 7 miles to Graham. The park is on the right.

ON SITE CAMPING

Frontier park has on-site RV camping spots. There are several locations in the trees near the ring site as well as a more traditional RV parking area in the grass field away from the rings. The sites in the trees have electricity only. Some sites in the rear field have water as well. Motorhomes and self-contained RVs are \$16/night with electricity (no water) and \$20/night with electricity and water. Tenting is also permitted for \$10/night. **These fees are subject to change by the parks department.** There are showers on site as well.

Register at the registration station at the south gate as you enter. Sites are first-come, first-serve, but camping is adequate. You will pay the park personnel directly. There is no charge for day parking.
