Entry Fees

First entry is \$20.00 per day; second entry of same dog, same day is \$10.00. Each entry of each dog includes \$3.00 AKC recording fee.

A refund of entry fees, less AKC recording fees and judges' fees, will be given for any bitch that comes into season, or any dog or handler that is injured or ill, **provided that written notification is provided to the Trial Secretary prior to the beginning of judging for the day.** Bitches in season are not allowed on the show grounds.

Catalogs may be pre-ordered for \$7 on the entry form. A limited number will be available at the trial for \$10.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

These trials are open to all dogs over the age of **15** months that are registered with the American Kennel Club or are registrable breeds that have obtained ILP numbers from AKC, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, blind or deaf dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.

Accommodations

Although we try to verify motel information, policies and ownerships can change; please check a facility's pet policy when making reservations. Some motels charge a refundable deposit, and others charge a nonrefundable pet fee, so please be sure to clarify these charges ahead of time.

Because of construction occurring at the school, RV parking and much of the day parking will be farther from the ring area this year. Vehicles will likely be parked on the soccer field west of the school. The school is doing their best to work with us, so please be flexible and plan on hauling your gear a greater distance this year. We are sorry for the inconvenience; we know that exhibitors like this site, so we are doing our best to make it work.

Volunteer Workers

As you probably know, there are quite a variety of tasks that go along with holding an agility trial, and we greatly appreciate volunteers to help share the work load. If you want to be scheduled for working ahead of time, please fill out the worker form and send it in with your entry. We will also have a white board for worker sign-up at the trials. Workers will receive a ticket for lunch each day they work.

Important Information for Exhibitors -- PLEASE READ!

Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone, fax, e-mail or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms, or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form, are not acceptable. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.

Owners are responsible for errors on entry blanks, for entering the same dog twice, or for entering a dog in a class for which it is not eligible, regardless of who makes such errors. Dogs wrongly entered in a class may not be transferred to another class after closing.

Entries sent by express mailing services MUST have the delivery signature requirement waived; otherwise they may not be delivered on time. The secretary will not pick up entries being held for signature, and no entries will be considered as being received until they are delivered.

Please note the opening date of March 6, 2009; no entries will be accepted before that date. Entries for a maximum of ten (10) dogs are allowed in one envelope; envelopes containing entries for more than ten dogs will be considered invalid, and will be returned to the sender. No hand delivered entries can be accepted until 8:00 AM on March 7, 2009.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, or in the event a dog is absent (other than as specified on page 2), disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Confirmation of entry and schedule of judging time will be sent to the address on the official AKC entry form after the closing date; if not received at least seven days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary. **Acknowledgment of receipt of entries prior to closing will be provided if the exhibitor provides a valid e-mail address on the entry form, or includes a stamped, self-addressed postcard with entry. Please do not telephone the secretary to ask if your entry was received.**

Spokane Dog Training Club, Inc. assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his or her parents or guardians. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of any fees paid will be made.

All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or designated warm-up area.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

The safety of dogs is of primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

Class Entry Information – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

This information is provided as a courtesy to exhibitors. If you are still unsure of what class to enter after reading this, please check with the Trial Secretary.

Novice Agility Class and **Novice Jumpers With Weaves Class** are divided into Divisions A and B. Division A is for persons and dogs that have never acquired **any** AKC agility title (Standard, JWW or FAST). Dogs eligible for Novice A may be entered in Novice B at the discretion of the owner. Division B is for dogs that have acquired an AKC agility title(s), persons that have handled a dog to any AKC agility title, and agility judges. Dogs handled at the trial by someone other than the owner, co-owner, or member of owner's household must be entered in Novice B. Dogs eligible for Novice A may be entered in Novice B at the owner's discretion. A dog may continue to be shown in the Novice B class until it has acquired a qualifying score towards its Open title.

Novice Agility Preferred Class and **Novice Jumpers With Weaves Class** are not divided into Divisions A and B. Handlers of all levels, judges, and dogs with AKC agility titles compete in the same class. This is the entry-level class for dogs starting in the Preferred program, even if they have upper level agility titles. There is no grandfathering into the Preferred class.

Open Standard Agility Class is open to dogs that have acquired the Novice Agility title (NA) but have not earned a qualifying score towards an Agility Excellent title. **Open Agility Preferred Class** is open to dogs that have acquired the Novice Agility Preferred title (NAP) but have not earned a qualifying score towards an Agility Excellent Preferred title. **Open Jumpers With Weaves Class** is open to dogs that have acquired the Novice JWW title (NAJ) but have not earned a qualifying score towards an Excellent JWW title. **Open Jumpers With Weaves Preferred Class** is open to dogs that have acquired the Novice JWW Preferred title (NJP) but have not earned a qualifying score towards an Excellent JWW Preferred title.

Agility Excellent Class is divided into Divisions A and B. Division A is open to dogs that have acquired the Open Agility title, but have not acquired a qualifying score towards their Master Agility Excellent title. Division B is open only to dogs that have acquired the Agility Excellent title, and dogs that have acquired the Master Agility Excellent title. **Agility Excellent Preferred Class** is also divided into Divisions A and B, with the same distinctions as the regular Excellent classes.

Excellent Jumpers With Weaves Class is divided into Divisions A and B. Division A is open to dogs that have acquired the Open JWW title, but have not acquired a qualifying score towards their Master Excellent JWW title. Division B is open only to dogs that have acquired the Excellent JWW title and to dogs that have acquired the Master Excellent JWW title. **Excellent JWW Preferred Class** is also divided into Divisions A and B, with the same distinctions as the regular Excellent JWW classes.

MX and MXJ legs, double qualifiers, and MACH points are earned only from the regular Excellent B and Excellent JWW B classes. Qualifying scores in the Excellent B Preferred and Excellent B JWW Preferred classes do not count toward MACH titles, but do count toward additional MXP and MJP titles.

All dogs must start at the Novice level in the FAST class. Dogs with **any** AKC agility title are not eligible for Novice A FAST, and must start in Novice B.

Move-Up Information

Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the handler, as a result of completing an agility title at an earlier event, provided that the request is made to the Trial Secretary, in writing (e-mail is acceptable), by 6:00 PM on **Monday, May 4, 2009**. If a dog finishes a title during the trial, the handler may move up for the following days by filling out a move-up form (available at the event) and turning it in to the Trial Secretary within one hour of the end of judging for the day.

Height Divisions

The following jump height divisions shall be used in all trial classes:

Regular	Preferred	
8"	4"	For dogs 11 inches and under at the withers.
12"	8"	For dogs 14 inches and under at the withers.
16"	12"	For dogs 18 inches and under at the withers.
20"	16"	For dogs 22 inches and under at the withers.
24"	20"	For dogs over 22 inches at the withers.
26"	---	Dogs may be entered at this height at owner's discretion.

In the Regular classes, handlers may choose to run in a higher height division, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. In the Preferred classes, dogs may NOT run in a higher height division than that determined by their withers height. Dogs that measure into an incorrect height division in Preferred will be moved up or down as necessary. In the Regular classes, dogs will be moved up if they measure above the cutoff, but will not be moved down for any trials that have already closed.

Height Card Information (PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!)

AKC now requires that all dogs obtain a height card. **If your dog has a permanent or unexpired temporary height card, please include a photocopy of the card with your entry; if you are measured for a card at another trial after entering, please send a copy of your documentation to the Trial Secretary.** If you do not include a height card with entry, we will need to see your dog's height card at the trial, or your dog will need to be measured **before** running. **Both of our judges are Volunteer Measuring Officials, so ALL dogs lacking a height card must be measured regardless of their jump height division.** Measuring information will be provided with confirmations, once we know how many dogs will need to be measured.

Awards

Rosettes will be awarded to 1st through 4th place in each height division in each Regular and each Preferred class.

First Place	Blue Rosette
Second Place	Red Rosette
Third Place	Yellow Rosette
Fourth Place	White Rosette

Dark green ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. First place in each height division of each class will receive a dog toy, valued at \$1 to \$5.

Within each Standard Agility class, JWW class and FAST class, the dog earning the highest score will receive a Rosette, and a Certificate good for a \$10 discount on one entry to any Spokane Dog Training Club AKC agility trial in 2009 or 2010. In the case of tied scores, the dog with the fastest **yards per second** running time wins. There will be separate High in Class awards for the Preferred classes. There will not be High in Trial awards at these trials.

A title pin will be awarded to each dog completing a standard or JWW agility title (NA, NAP, OA, OAP, AX, AXP, MX, MXP, NAJ, NJP, OAJ, OJP, AXJ, AJP, MXJ, MJP, MACH, PAX) at either of these trials. A Rosette and jump bar will be awarded to any dog completing a MACH or PAX at either of these trials. A qualifying score is required for all awards. All awards must be claimed at the show; none will be mailed.

*** If you think that you may complete a MACH or PAX at these trials, please let the trial secretary know ahead of time! ***

Judging

Judging starts at 3:30 PM on Friday, 8:00 a.m. on both Saturday and Sunday. Judge's briefing and course walk-through will take place prior to that time, to be specified in entry confirmation. We will be running two rings **alternately** in the following order:

On Friday, the first class will be Excellent Standard, followed by Excellent JWW.

On Saturday, both rings will start with FAST, followed by the standard classes in Ring 1 and JWW in Ring 2.

On Sunday, Ring 1 will start with standard classes, then FAST. Ring 2 will start with JWW, then FAST.

On Friday and Saturday, jump height divisions will be run Small to Tall. On Sunday, they will be run Tall to Small. Running order within divisions will be determined by random draw, except that multiple dogs handled by the same person will be separated wherever possible. Preferred Class dogs will generally run at the end of each height, except when it is necessary to separate dogs as above.

Site Information

These Agility Trials will be held outdoors on grass, ring size 100' by 100'. Two rings will be used, one for standard classes and one for JWW. Water and portable toilets are on site. There is some shade, but please be prepared to provide shade for your dogs. And of course, we know you will uphold the great reputation of agility exhibitors by cleaning up after your dogs! Please be aware that Spokane County Parks policy prohibits amplified music or alcoholic beverages within the park.

Obstacles

Obstacles used will meet the specifications given in the current AKC regulations.

Refreshments

Coffee, water and lemonade will be available as a courtesy for exhibitors. We will not be providing lunch, except for trial workers. (Spokane County Health Department regulations do not permit us to sell food or accept donations for food.)

Directions to Show

From either the east or west, take I-90 to the Maple Street Bridge exit (#280) and go north approximately 4 miles. [The one-way northbound street starts out as Walnut, then becomes Maple; Ash is one-way south.] Turn left (west) on Francis, which becomes Nine Mile Road (State Highway 291). Just after Nine Mile Falls (small store/gas station, post office), turn left (west) on Charles Road, which crosses the Spokane River at Nine Mile Dam. Sontag Park is on the right just after the bridge, and Nine Mile Falls Elementary School is just past the park.

AGREEMENT

I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers may opt to enter in a higher height division for all *Regular* titling classes and the *FAST* titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division.

Dogs entered in the *Preferred* classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. The Judge's measurement will be valid for this trial *or back-to-back trials* only.
